From the Rabbi's Study

How Do We Create Community?

Last November, instead of writing a monthly column, I presented this visual which was followed by lists of the myriad activities we do under the headings of prayer, study, and assembly.



Question: What does it take to create a kehillat kedushah: a holy community engaged in meaningful, joyful, and soulful prayer embedded with music; a kehillat talmudim: a community of learners in which children and adults are interested in acquiring deep and broad Jewish knowledge; and a kehillat hesed: a caring community which responds to the needs of our own congregants as well as to the needs of the larger community?

Answer: YOU

My purpose? It was two-fold: to demonstrate the breadth and depth of the things we do here at Congregation B'nai Jeshurun and... to remind you that we can't do any of this alone—without you. It was an open invitation for you to find something in congregational life that speaks to you, that enriches your life.

I know, and truly understand, that your lives are busy, with demands pulling you in many directions. I also know that, for the Temple to be one of your priorities, and for you to find greater meaning and purpose in your membership, it's not just about our being a welcoming community or offering interesting classes and programs. Rather, it's about creating opportunities to develop and deepen relationships throughout the congregation.

Yes, we're an organization - but most importantly, and at all times, we are people. And we need to get to know one another better and in different ways. So...let's experiment.

Pop-Up Shabbat Dinners

One of the first things we're going to do is to offer Pop-Up Shabbat Dinners. Once a month, instead of Shabbat Services, we're going to organize Shabbat dinners in congregants' homes. Jon and I will host (and cook) a dinner in our home while other congregants will host potluck dinners in their homes. It's an opportunity to break bread together, to have unexpected conversations, to welcome Shabbat with candle, wine, and challah blessings, and to enjoy each other's company in a relaxed setting. My hope is that each of you will attend at least one dinner; that you'll meet someone new or get to know someone in a much deeper way than you did before.... or, maybe, both.

We'll probably begin these dinners in July. If you would like to host a dinner in July or August, please let me know ASAP. Hosts only need to open the door with a smile and provide a set table. Let me know how many guests you can accommodate, if you have pets (and what kind), if you are wheel-chair accessible, and if there are any restrictions (non-smoking, fragrance free, glutenfree etc.). For guests, more details (with dates) and a sign-up form will be available soon.
