#### **WORLD ZIONIST CONGRESS**

Every five years, the Jewish community has the chance to participate in an election that helps determine the Jewish future in Israel and around the world. With its origins in 1897, the 38<sup>th</sup> World Zionist Congress will take place in Israel ithis coming October. Elected representatives from Israel and world Jewish communities make decisions and set policies regarding the Jewish state, Jewish life in the diaspora, and how to tackle antisemitism worldwide.

152 delegates will be elected from the United States. When we Vote Reform (for ARZA, the American Reform Zionist Association), we help ensure that our Reform values and points of view will be represented.

You can vote online to select US delegates from now through March 11, 2020. For information and instructions about how to vote, **CLICK HERE**. Please note, there is a small registration fee of \$7.50 (or \$5.00 for those aged 18-25) to offset election costs.

### From the Rabbi's Study

#### URJ Biennial Take-Aways, Part Two - Are You In?



Two days after returning home from the 2019 URJ Biennial in Chicago, I received the Clergy Edition of the URJ's Inside Leadership newsletter in my email inbox. It contained an article from the URJ's Mark Pelavin titled: *Are You In? 5 Takeaways from the 2019 URJ Biennial*. In Mark's words, "the Biennial's impact doesn't end when the conference

does." In many ways, the real impact of Biennial – on those who attended and on our home congregations-just begins after we return home.

Mark asked, "Are you ready to act?" and he wrote about five areas we could commit to, or at least to ask for more information about:

#### 1. Expand participation of the next generation

This is about reaching out and connecting to families with young children, to teenagers, to college students, and to people in their 20's and 30's. The URJ is asking us to commit to enhancing one of more of the following:

- Our connections to URJ camps, NFTY or other youth programs
- Making the most out of Tot Shabbat or other events to connect with young families
- Learning more about how to connect people in their 20s and 30s to Jewish life

# 2. Participate in the Reform Movement's 2020 Civic Engagement Campaign

This is about nonpartisan civic engagement and participatory democracy: our congregants' commitment to voting in upcoming elections and helping to empower others to vote as well. The URJ asks for us to commit to one or more of the following:

- Learn more about the Reform Movement's 2020 Civic Engagement Campaign
- Learn skills to help lead my community/congregation's civic engagement work
- Vote in the U.S. elections on November 3, 2020

Before I left Chicago, I personally committed to all three. What are you willing to commit to?

### 3. Be an agent of change in your congregation

The URJ believes that only in changing with the times can Jewish life remain strong, robust, innovative, and thriving. The URJ is offering its support to help congregations move up the change continuum and asks if we're willing to commit to one or more of the following:

- Explore how our congregation compares to URJ congregational benchmarks
- Learn about bringing URJ board workshops to our congregation
- Learn about areas in which you can help create change in our congregation

## 4. Vote Reform in the World Zionist Congress elections

When we vote in the World Zionist Congress elections, and choose Reform, we increase the Reform voice and pluralism in Israel. We are asking every member of our congregation to vote. Your vote in this election is the only democratic opportunity you have to influence Israeli society. Voting is easy to do online and it's open now:

- Go to **Zionistelection.org** and register.
- · Pay the one-time processing fee
- Vote Reform!

# 5. Address equity, inclusion, and anti-racism in my congregation

How are we doing regarding audacious hospitality: the focused effort to embrace our diversity and reach out to those not currently engaged in Jewish life? The URJ asks us to commit to one or more of the following:

- Assess our congregation's diversity, equity, and inclusion efforts using resources from the Audacious Hospitality Toolkit
- Schedule a training about equity, inclusion, and antiracism

Now, I'd like to ask *you*, "are you in?" What do you value and care about the most in congregational life? What areas would you like to bring your passions, ideas, and talents to? What should our priorities be? Please let me and your Temple leadership know. Let's talk!
