- You can also drive by, and pause to shout greetings, honk, wave, flash your lights, etc.

RESPONDING TO COMMUNITY NEEDS



The City of Lincoln recently introduced a new resource to those in need in our community and those

wanting to serve through the new Aging Partners program called NeighborLNK. The goal of the program is to serve seniors (60+) as well as persons with disabilities in the community ("neighbors") who are homebound as a result of the COVID-19 crisis.

NeighborLNK facilitates personal connections by directly linking volunteers with such individuals.

- If you're a senior (60+) or a person with disabilities and interested in being paired with a volunteer in this program to receive services, you may apply by calling 402-441-7575 to request a neighbor application packet, or you may apply by <u>downloading</u> and filling out the packet and emailing it to <u>NeighborLNK@lincoln.ne.gov</u>. There is no cost to participate in the program.
- If you're 19 years or older and are interested in serving as a volunteer in this program, you may apply by filling out the <u>volunteer application</u> <u>packet</u> and emailing the completed packet to <u>NeighborLNK@lincoln.ne.gov</u>

A MESSAGE FROM OUR CONGREGATION PRESIDENTS

In response to the vandalism of the South Street Temple in January and elsewhere in Lincoln last week, and "as an expression of our community's shared values," Mayor Leirion Gaylor Baird recently announced that her administration is proposing an ordinance to the City Council that would strengthen the city's ability to respond to acts of hate. You can see some highlights of that news conference here. There is also a summary here.

On **Monday**, **June 8** at **3:00 pm**, the Lincoln City Council will hear comments on the Hate Intimidation ordinance which is designed to create a new offense under the City Code called "hate intimidation" that could be charged to an individual who commits a violation of a city ordinance with the intent to intimidate a person due to that person's (actual or perceived) status, including race, color, religion, physical or mental disability, national origin, age, ancestry, gender, sexual orientation, gender identity, and gender expression.

The Hate Intimidation Ordinance would:

- Allow the city prosecutor to charge perpetrators of hate crimes in the city of Lincoln.
- Apply to additional types of crimes beyond those included in state statutes, crimes such as destruction of property and disturbing the peace.
- Demonstrate that hate has no home in Lincoln and that every resident belongs here.

Your voice is critical! Together we can make sure that all Lincolnites are safe.
