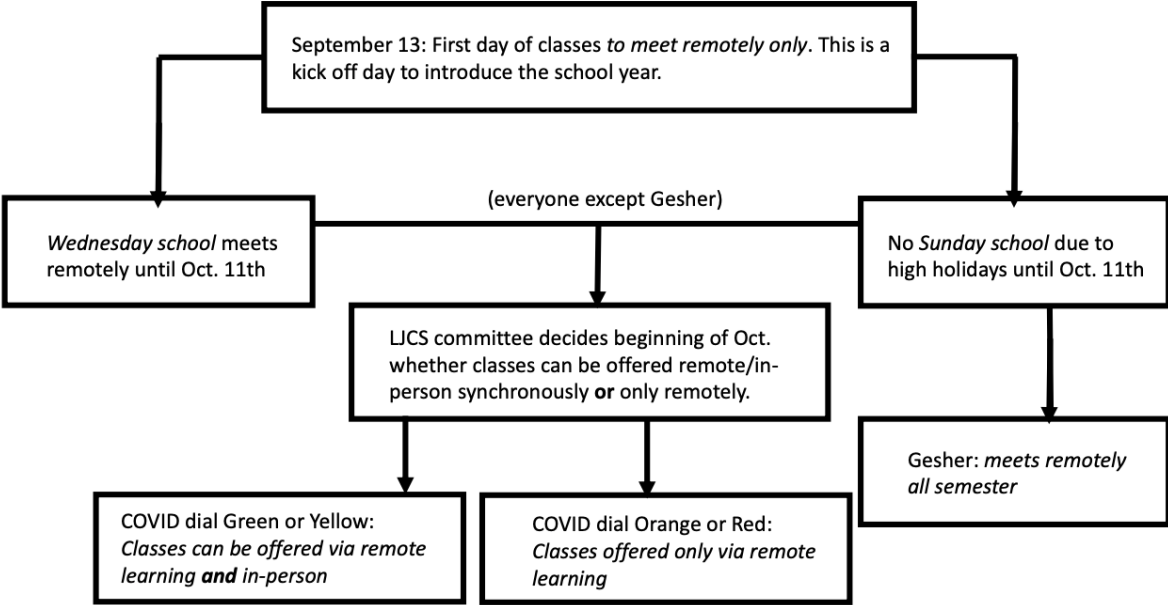

LJCS NEWS

We know that you have been waiting anxiously to hear about plans for this upcoming year of religious school. Due to the COVID-19 epidemic there has been a lot of uncertainty which we are still facing. The LJCS school committee and both congregational presidents have drafted a plan for the fall semester that addresses both a short term plan until High Holy Days and also looking ahead to the later part of the semester. Here is a simple flowchart to depict the decision-making process that the LJCS school committee will be using:



Key dates and points to be aware of are as follows:

- All classes will be remote only until after the high holidays. The LJCS committee will meet early October to finalize the plan for whether we will offer remote-only or a synchronous remote/in-person option for the remainder of the semester for all classes other than Gesher.
- The first day of remote classes will be **September 13** and this will be a Kick-off Day for the school year.
- Gesher will meet remotely for the entire semester.

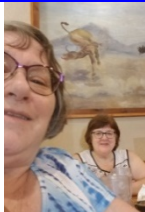

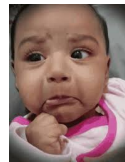
